1. Friends We Don't Know (vs 1-2)

What do you have that God hasn't given you? And if everything you have is from God, why boast as though it were not a gift? **1Corinthians 4:7**

2. Friends We Don't Need (vs 3-4)

Make no friendship with a man given to anger, nor go with a wrathful man, lest you learn his ways and entangle yourself in a snare. **Proverbs 22:24-25**
